
Help Us Keep Hope Alive in our Community!

You may encounter someone on the street with a sign that reads, "Homeless - Need Help," and your reaction might be to offer cash, however, we encourage a different approach. Many individuals experiencing homelessness have lost their jobs, faced disabilities, or lack support from family and friends. Others may be dealing with mental health issues or addiction. What they truly need is a safe place to stay, compassionate support, and an opportunity to rebuild their lives.

For over 158 years, we have been providing a helping hand to those in need, guiding them toward a brighter future.

The St. Vincent de Paul "Hope Card" informs individuals facing homelessness about the services we offer. We invite you to print copies of the Hope Card and keep a few in your pocket or car. Instead of giving cash, our Hope Card connects people to essential resources that can help them transition out of homelessness. We offer warm meals, shelter, and a chance to have a fresh start — all at no cost. Those who truly need these services will be incredibly grateful for your assistance.

Save on Your Taxes and Help St. Vincent de Paul

Did you know that if you're 70½ years old or older, you can donate directly from your taxable IRA to St. Vincent de Paul without incurring any income tax on the amount? This transfer won't count as taxable income, nor will it provide a tax deduction, making it advantageous even if you don't itemize your deductions. Additionally, if you haven't yet taken your required minimum distribution for the year, your IRA charitable rollover can fulfill all or part of that obligation. If your spouse is also 70½ or older, they too can contribute from their taxable IRA. For more information, on this type of contribution, contact your tax or financial advisor.
